Notice to Employee

No action by the employee is required at this time.



Oklahoma law requires you to be notified that your employer or their workers' compensation insurance carrier has reported you may have been involved in a work-related accident or may have a work-related illness.



In the event a workers' compensation insurance claim is established by your employer with their insurance carrier, your primary contact for information will be their insurance company and adjuster assigned to your claim.



Your insurance adjuster will play a key role in managing and resolving workers' compensation claims. Your adjuster will investigate, document, coordinate with medical professionals for your timely medical treatment, where appropriate, and authorize payments or other approved benefits.



Pursuant to 85A O.S. § 109(C), the Oklahoma Workers' Compensation Commission (WCC) offers helpful services for employees. The WCC's Counselor Division staff can answer your questions about Oklahoma's workers' compensation laws or assist you in contacting insurance adjusters or other medical professionals, if needed. The WCC also provides mediation services to help resolve claim disputes.



Please Note: If you are represented by an attorney in your workers' compensation claim, Oklahoma Law limits the ability of the WCC Counselor's Division to visit with you. Representation by an attorney is not required to pursue an action for benefits with the WCC. However, if you are represented, please contact your attorney in any matter pertaining to your claim.
